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**Helen Falcon**  
**Postgraduate Dental Dean and COPDEND Chair Health Education Thames Valley and Wessex**

Helen is currently Chair of the UK Committee of Postgraduate Dental Deans and Directors (COPDEND), having served as Vice Chair for 7 years, and is a member of Council of the UK Academy of Medical Educators. She was appointed Director of Postgraduate Dental Education in the Oxford Deanery in January 2005 and to Thames Valley and Wessex Deaneries in 2007. She was an appointed member of the General Dental Council from 2009-2013, a member of the GDC Education and Audit Committees and briefly chaired the Education Committee. She is a former President of the National Association of Prison Dentistry UK and was a member of the Department of Health Foundation Steering Group. Her career has included time as a Vocational Trainer, Vocational Training Adviser, Audit Fellow at the Royal College of Surgeons of England, Research Fellow at the Eastman Dental Institute, and senior NHS Trust management roles. She has sat on a number of national dental working groups including Options for Change and the Patient Charges Working Group and has been a member of the British Dental Association's CCCPHD Executive. She also chaired the NHS South Central Clinical Simulation Strategy Group from 2008-2012.

Research interests include development of standards for postgraduate dental education, situational judgement tests for recruitment, dental general anaesthesia, the development of NHS dental services and priority setting for specialist restorative dental care. She has chaired working groups for dentists with a special interest in prison dentistry, developing guidelines for dental educators and an educational portfolio for dental foundation training.



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#### **Barry Cockcroft CBE**

#### **Chief Dental Officer (England)**

Barry worked for 27 years in largely NHS general dental practice before joining the Department of Health as Deputy Chief Dental Officer (England) in November 2002 and in July 2006 was appointed Chief Dental Officer (England).

From 1997, he was the clinical lead in developing and running a first wave Personal Dental Services pilot in Rugby which was based on capitation as a method of remuneration in NHS general practice.

In 2001 he led one of the Task Groups which formed the basis of the *Options for Change* report, the policy document which led to the introduction of a commissioned dental service in the 2006 reforms.

In 2007 he was awarded a Honorary Fellowship by the Faculty of Dental Surgery and in 2008 was awarded an Honorary Fellowship from the University of Central Lancashire.

In 2010 he was awarded a CBE in the New Years Honours List.

In 2011 he was awarded an Honorary Fellowship from the Faculty of General Dental Practice.

Barry has recently been appointed as Chief Dental Officer to NHS England, Department of Health and Health Education England.





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#### **Sue Gregory OBE**

#### **Director of Dental Public Health, Public Health England**

As part of the organisational changes in April 2013 Sue moved to Public Health England as Director of Dental Public Health, together with the network of consultants in dental public health in England. Immediately before this she was Deputy Chief Dental Officer at Department of Health England from January 2009. As part of her wide portfolio, including dental public health, she was heavily involved in the development and implementation of pilots to test a care pathway and quality and outcomes approach as a basis for reform of dental contract in England. Prior to moving to DH she worked across Bedfordshire, Luton and Hertfordshire PCTs. where she had a long standing interest in the primary/secondary care interface and ensuring equity of service provision alongside reducing inequalities.

Sue chaired the joint DH/BASCD working group which developed “Delivering better oral health” and is a Past President of the British Association for the Study of Community Dentistry (2006/2007) and British Society for Disability and Oral Health (1992)

She has worked on numerous national committees and working groups, including being an invited member of the Board of Faculty of Dental Surgery (RCS England)

Many moons ago Sue was District Dental Officer across Bedfordshire and Luton and managed the Community Dental Service.



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### **Stephen Lambert-Humble MBE**

#### **Postgraduate Dental Dean Health Education Kent, Surrey & Sussex**

Professor Stephen Lambert-Humble is the Dean of Postgraduate Dentistry for Kent Surrey and Sussex, National Lead Dean for Dental Care Professionals and a Consultant in Dental Public Health.

He had a full career in the Royal Navy leaving in 2003 as the first Dental Dean for all the Armed Forces. He manages all the dental education and development in his area, and is a passionate advocate for the use of Skill-Mix. He has been Vice Dean of FGDP (UK) twice, set up their Advisory Board for DCPs and their Examination Boards for Dental Hygienists, Dental Therapists and Clinical Dental Technicians, and almost singlehandedly set up the training for CDTs against much opposition.

He was awarded an MBE for services to Dental Care and Education in the 2012 New Year Honours List.



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#### **Colette Bridgman MBE**

##### **Consultant in Dental Public Health, Public Health England**

Colette Bridgman is a Consultant in Dental Public Health co-located with NHS England Greater Manchester area team. She is a member of NHS England National Commissioning Steering Group for dentistry as Chair of the task group on oral surgery / OMFS pathway implementation.

Prior to reorganisation she was with NHS Greater Manchester and seconded to the NHS Commissioning Board, on the development of strategy for commissioning secondary, primary and salaried dental services in England – 'Securing Excellence'. As an Associate Specialist Clinical Adviser with Primary Care Commissioning National Dental Team since 2003, she contributed to the national oral health policy 'Choosing Better Oral Health', and Chaired the Department of Health working group producing 'Valuing Peoples Oral Health'. A service redesign project, she led on in NHS general dental practices in Oldham and Salford in 2007 was cited by the independent NHS dentistry review team in 2009, as a good practice model. A similar approach is being piloted in the pilot programme in England.

She qualified from Manchester in 1983 was appointed Consultant in 2003. She served as President of BASCD in 2009/10 and established and chaired the LPN for Greater Manchester to April 2013. She was a member of DoH new contract working group in 2010/11 and contributed to the development of the Pilot Dental Quality and Outcomes Framework and Pilots clinical training programme. She has contributed to the DoH advanced care pathway groups in oral surgery, periodontology and paediatrics and was awarded a MBE in 2012/2013.



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#### **Linda Prescott-Clements**

#### **Director of PCA Consulting Limited**

Professor Linda Prescott-Clements has worked within health professions education for 15 years, and has a strong reputation within dental education within the UK. She obtained a PhD in Dental Education, and Masters of Health Professions Education at Maastricht University in the Netherlands, and has completed a number of research and development projects in curriculum development and assessment. She has published widely within international peer reviewed journals, and her work has had a direct impact on medical and dental education policy across Europe.

Linda has been recognised at the highest level as Principal Fellow of the Higher Education Academy (PFHEA), and has held senior academic and leadership roles including Associate Dean for Learning and Teaching, Associate Dean for Academic Programmes, Professor of Professional Education and Dental Education Projects Manager.

In addition to being the lead researcher responsible for the development and evaluation of the system of assessment for satisfactory completion of Dental Vocational Training in Scotland, she has supported COPDEND in the development of a competency framework, assessment and portfolio for DFT in the UK.



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#### **Tony Anderson**

**Director of Postgraduate GDP Education and national lead for CPD and for Clinical Audit, NHS Education for Scotland**

Tony Anderson was appointed as the first Director of Postgraduate GDP Education in 2002 for the South East region of Scotland, where he works for NHS Education for Scotland (NES).

After qualifying from Newcastle Dental School in 1984, he was a vocational trainee on the first voluntary scheme in the Northern Deanery and then worked in general dental practice for just over 20 years. He initially became involved in postgraduate dental education as a CPD tutor in 1989 and was also a VT trainer several times.

He undertook a number of roles in the Deanery eventually becoming the Associate Dean before moving to Scotland. Within the new structure for the NES Dental Directorate, he will be the national lead for Clinical Audit as well as the national lead for CPD.
